# **New technical information on-line**

Two new pieces of MPA Mortar technical information are now available on-line to download.

Data sheet 24, Repointing external brickwork, explains that mortar in poor condition can lead to a loss in wall strength. This is often found in old properties where mortar is powdery or easily scraped away so that the joints are appreciably recessed. Incorrect use of pressure cleaning of fresh mortar in

new masonry can also affect the strength of new construction and must be avoided. The data sheet goes on to identity the need for repointing, normally developing from a visual inspection of a property. A checklist is provided covering various factors including spalling at the edges of bricks, powdery mortar, eroded and recessed joints, rain penetration and cracking.

Learning text 14, Cleaning brickwork, stresses that, for long-term durability, it is vital that

fresh brickwork is not high-pressure, jet washed. This damages the clean, smooth face of a mortar joint which a bricklayer has spent time and care to create. The learning text continues by outlining measures to be taken to ensure cleaning of fresh brickwork is carried out in a safe manner.

Restoration of the former Belmont Works factory in Birmingham city centre, is an exemplar of how dilapidated, landmark buildings can be revived for modern purpose. The grade A-listed building, owned by Birmingham City University, had been derelict since being gutted by fire in 2007. The refurbished building's design – work of architect, Aukett Swanke – has created space for a range of high-tech production equipment, masterclasses and workshops.

To meet the requirements of main contractor, Bowmer and Kirkland and brickwork contractor, Phoenix Brickwork, CPI EuroMix supplied 350 tonnes of dry mortar to the redevelopment. Dry mortar was delivered in two colours: an M4 Col E180 (Light Buff) and an M4 Colour E120 (Light Lilac).

CPI was able to enhance the programme's sustainability. Delivery mileage was significantly reduced due to the mortars' manufacture at CPI's Bilston plant, just nine miles from Birmingham. CPI's on-site silo mixing stations used, hold up to 35 tonnes of dry mortar.
